Day 1:

- 10:00AM Arrive in beautiful Door County and start your journey by taking the back roads through Southern Door and view over a dozen barn quilts. This “clothes line of quilts” was painted and designed by FFA members and alumni, volunteers and local quilt guild members to educate on the art and history of quilting while highlighting the architecture and historical significance of barns throughout Door County.
- 11:30AM Lunch. Stop at one of the many scrumptious restaurants around the peninsula. www.doorcounty.com/where-to-dine
- 12:30AM Take a scenic boat tour, nature or trolley ride and get inspired for your next project.
- 3:00PM Check into one of the many hotels, homes, cottages or B&B’s that have the perfect set up for a quilters retreat. Many are equipped with small or large meeting spaces, cozy common areas and sleeping rooms equipped with full kitchens, dining rooms and living room spaces with fireplaces.
- 5:00PM Find out what all the hype is about and take part in an authentic Door County fish boil. Served at over a dozen locations around the county. www.doorcounty.com/where-to-dine/fish-boils
- 7:00PM See a show! Half a dozen performing art venues speckle Door County. Check out www.doorcounty.com/arts-culture/performing-arts to see all there is to offer.

Day 2:

- 8:00AM Breakfast at the hotel or out and about.
- 9:00AM Start the morning off with some SHOPPING! There are hundreds of artists, galleries and shops around the peninsula. Be sure to stop at Barn Door Quilts in Sturgeon Bay and Quilters Quest in Sister Bay for any tools or material you may need. - 11:00AM Take a tour of a lighthouse. Door County boast 11 historic lighthouses and both Eagle Bluff Lighthouse in Peninsula State Park and Cana Island Lighthouse in Baileys Harbor are open for groups to enjoy.
- 12:30PM Lunch. Stop at one of the many scrumptious restaurants around the peninsula. www.doorcounty.com/where-to-dine
- 1:30PM No tour of Door County is complete without a tour and tasting of at least one of its award winning wineries. Tour one or tour all six, they each have something unique to offer every visitor. <http://www.doorcounty.com/what-to-do/wineries>
- 3:00PM Spend the afternoon mingling with other quilters sharing techniques and ideas or an afternoon to yourself working on your latest creation.
- 6:00PM Dinner at one of the many restaurants around the county. www.doorcounty.com/where-to-dine
- 7:00PM Show off your creative style at Hands On Art Studio. Paint your own ceramics, glassware, t-shirts and birdhouses. Spin-paint a canvas. Experiment with fused glass and lampworking. Make a mosaic. Weld a metal sculpture or create silver jewelry with precious metal clay.

- 10:00AM Depart for home or stay a few more days to enjoy everything Door County has to offer.
